

In March <u>Gia Maione Prima Foundation</u> announced its new partnership with Horns to Havana with support from the New Orleans-based <u>Trombone Shorty Foundation</u>. The collaboration kicked-off this past January when **Trombone Shorty Foundation's Executive Director Bill Taylor** traveled to Cuba with the Horns to Havana team to donate eight new horns to Horns to Havana music students. Changing Lives through Instruments



musician, producer, and composer from Pinar del Rio combines Afro-Cuban rhythms, Nigerian Afrobeat, and funk grooves to create music that is getting people from Havana to Santiago de Cuba and from New Orleans to New York dancing and *gozando* with contagious melodies and rhythms.


