





A TRADITION OF EXCELLENCE

There are more than 30 athletic and extracurricular programs at Warren Easton. The 2014-15 girls' basketball team won the state championship, the first time in history a public school in New Orleans has earned that honor. The football team was the Division 4A state runner up in the championship game played in December 2014 in the Superdome, the first appearance in a title game since 1958.



The centennial flag plaza was created to memorialize the 100th anniversary of the school's opening at its current site.






Located just four blocks from the Warren Easton campus is

MACKEL GOLF TOURNAMENT, named for former Eagle Frank Mackel.






